And at that moment he hit the overhead powerlines to the farm!





"If it had been a plane it would have been spread all over the grass in a million bits," said the first man.






"Well, there's something in the grass. See!"


Spike didn't wait. He raced back to Hound and called up the Autobot base.

"Hold your fire!" shouted Megatron. "I give the orders. And they're still out of range...at least two kilometres away!"




Laserbeak. They were making straight for the woods where Megatron and the Deceptions were hidden!
